Restoring Audubon Islands Sanctuary

Seventy years ago, herons, egrets, and pelicans nesting on several small islands in Lake Worth Lagoon led Audubon to designate the islands as sanctuaries. Prominent local families leased the islands to Audubon to ensure their conservation. Today, we are restoring their natural beauty. These unique lagoon islands offer:

meditative respite for connecting with nature

subtropical hardwood hammocks and mangrove forests

nesting and roosting for migratory songbirds and native waterbirds

When restored, the islands will reveal beautiful hardwood hammocks with gumbo limbo, buttonwood, fig and paradise trees, and the mangrove forest will thrive. The oyster bars will also help clean the water of Lake Worth Lagoon.

Restoration requires extensive removal of non-native pest trees and plants, and replanting with native species to recreate a subtropical oasis. The islands will be managed by Audubon with local partners and volunteers.
