


Would you favor or oppose a proposal currently being considered by the state legislature to allow offshore drilling for oil and natural gas within three miles of the Florida coastline?











Do you favor or oppose Governor Scott's proposal to cut the Everglades restoration budget from \$50 million a year down to \$17 million a year?







Summary of Key Messages

The everglades and our state's other natural lakes, rivers, and waterways improve the quality of life for our state's residents and families and must be protected.	83%	12%
One in three Floridians depend directly on the everglades for their daily supply of fresh water. If the everglades are not restored, the state's water supply will be jeopardized.	82%	12%
Florida needs to attract new businesses and industries to Florida to create jobs and strengthen the economy. This can not happen without access to a stable water supply.	79%	15%
The everglades restoration project will create 22,000 short to mid-term jobs on the restoration itself, and more than 442,000 jobs will be created over the next several decades in tourism, real estate, and commercial and recreational fishing industries due to restoration of the everglades.	79%	16%
A recent economic study found that we generate four dollars in economic activity for the state of Florida for every one dollar invested in everglades restoration.	73%	19%
